Kaua'i native and Red Raider Alumnus Dillon Ancheta is a Digital Anchor at Hawai'i News Now. He's in the anchor chair of the HNN Digital Center weekdays at noon. He's worked in local news since 2016, covering Hawai'i's biggest events from The Merrie Monarch Festival, to Kamehameha Schools Song Contest, and all the news in between.

Dillon graduated from Kaua'i High School in 2014 before moving to O'ahu to pursue his bachelor's degree in journalism at the University of Hawai'i at Mānoa. While in high school, Dillon was an 'Ōlelo Youth XChange Finalist three years in a row. Since then, he's given back to the community as a voice for locals, LGBTQ+ individuals, and the people of Kaua'i. 


